Phyllis Rosenblum: Classical Beat

Mesut Ozgen displayed his dazzling classical guitar playing Saturday evening in John Orlando's Cabrillo College Distinguished Artists Concert and Lecture Series.

The program at Resurrection Church of Aptos featured folk-inspired music from several countries. Video displays projected behind the performer, were, for me, a distraction whose relation to the performance were hard to discern.

Ozgen, an award-winning international performer, has been on the UC Santa Cruz faculty since 1998. For seven years, before making the guitar his career, he was a practicing physician.

Crystalline notes glistened in "Variations on an Anatolian Folk Song" by Carlo Domeniconi. Here, sensitive phrasing delineated various treatments of the haunting tune "Uzun ince bir yoldayim" (I am on a Long and Narrow Road) from Ozgen's own Turkish heritage. Two Latin-flavored works — the Peruvian "Misionera," by Fernando Bustamonte, and the Argentine "Sortija" by Pablo Ortiz — bounced with lively rhythms and rich harmonies. Ozgen's own "Anatolian Fantasy" drifted elegantly through various contrasting moods. "Tango Cruz" was a charming gem Ozgen wrote for a friend's birthday.

Works by Christopher Pratorius, Robert Beaser and Benjamin Verdery rounded out the program. Ozgen rewarded the enthusiastic audience response with an encore: Francisco Tarrega's lilting "Recuerdos de la Alhambra."

The Distinguished Artists' next concert June 25 features awardwinning young pianists from the "Gold Country Piano Institute." This elite piano school is directed by Pawel Skrzypek, who has presented several immensely popular all-Chopin concerts at Cabrillo College.

Nailing it

Classical guitarists worry about their fingernails. They don't use plastic picks, as pop quitarists do. I once sat in on a classical quitar master class, and I was amazed at the amount of time spent discussing fingernails.

While the left hand, nails must be short, so they don't interfere with pressing the strings down on the frets; the right-hand nails need to be long enough to pluck the strings as smooth as possible. Classical quitarists carry special nail files, buffers and supplies of fine-grade sandpaper which they sometimes even use on stage during a concert. Should a nail



replacement can be made by gluing on a segment of a cut-up Ping-Pong ball.

I felt like the Lone Ranger riding off after a rescue as I drove away from Santa Cruz Gardens Elementary School last Friday. I was lucky to also be taking private lessons, so I always had a few tips to share. I definitely recommend private lessons whenever possible. They start beginners off with correct technique and can help Sponsored Links avoid major frustrations.
